Blood Clot Prevention After Surgery:

Adult Aspirin 325mg daily for 4 weeks **OR** Aspirin 81mg Twice Daily.

Medications:

Please stop all Advil and like products 5 days before surgery.

No additional Tylenol while taking the narcotics; it is already included in the pain medication.

Please give 24 hours for any medication refills.

Wound Care:

Most incisions will be closed by a product called a 'zip line' - this replaces the staples we used in the past. It will remain in place for 3 weeks. We still ask that this area stays dry.

Please do not use any oils, ointments, or lotion in the incision area.

You will be put in a sling after surgery and need to wear this for 3 weeks.

Showering:

With total shoulders, we will put a waterproof dressing on after surgery. This will keep your incision dry while showering. If you notice any water getting under your bandage, please contact the office so we can get that changed. Do not rub or wash the waterproof dressing; pat dry after showers.
